Thank you for allowing me to share my horse's achievements. He really is my once in a lifetime horse!"

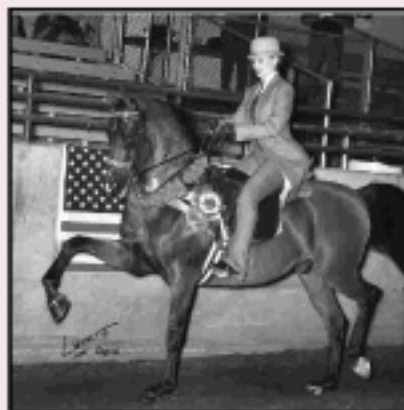
